



MPavilion/ Art Monthly Australasia Writing Award

2017 Guidelines, Terms & Conditions

MPavilion's unique annual architecture commission and design event for Melbourne in partnership with Australia's art magazine of record, Art Monthly Australasia, present an innovative writing award to explore the flourishing field of interdisciplinary practice within art and design.

Australian writers are invited to submit a proposal for an essay exploring one or more aspects of the **relationship between art and design today**. The winning writer will receive \$3,000 to develop their submission for an essay to be published in an issue of Art Monthly Australasia. The winning writer will also be invited as a guest of MPavilion to participate in a public event in association with their essay as part of the official 2017/18 season of MPavilion in Melbourne.

Funding available

One applicant will be awarded \$3,000 (excluding GST)

Closing date

23:59 AEST Saturday 1st July 2017.

Criteria for Evaluation

- Essay explores one or more aspects of the relationships between art and design;
- Demonstrated high quality of work to date, as evidenced in CV;
- Demonstrated capacity to execute essay.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be the person requesting the award;
- Applicants must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident;
- Applicants must be submitting an original work;
- Late or incomplete applications will not be assessed;
- Previous MPavilion/ Art Monthly Australasia Writing Award winners are not eligible

- to apply;
- All other considerations being equal, NAVA members will be given priority.

Successful Applicant Requirements

Payment

NAVA will contact successful applicants and request a Tax Invoice or a Statement by a Supplier if you do not have an ABN. If the applicant is unable to provide either, under PAYG, NAVA is required to withhold 46.5% of the grant and send it to the Australian Taxation Office. Payment to successful applicants will be made after notification by direct transfer to the applicant's nominated bank account (or

Publication of essay

- The winning writer will be required to supply an essay to be published in either the September, October or November issue of *Art Monthly Australasia*.
- The essay, of no more than 2,000 words, must be ready for publication by September 2017 (date to be determined by AMA).
- Applicants are required to source images to compliment their essay.
- An agreement will be entered into with the winning writer. Conditions will be in accordance with the NAVA Code of Practice.
- The winning writer may be asked to make themselves available to the media by phone, email or in person following the announcement of the winner.
- The winning writer will be invited as a guest of MPavilion to participate in a public event in association with their essay as part of the official 2017/18 season of MPavilion in Melbourne.

Reproduction of work

The winning writer must warrant that they have the full power to make the following agreement: that the essay is an entirely original work; that it contains no defamatory matter, any material in breach of official secrets, laws or any matter which invades any

individual's rights of privacy and that all statements in the manuscript purporting to be facts are true.

The winning writer must warrant that the essay has not been previously licensed for exclusive use in any form and territory and that it is capable of protection by copyright in all territories for which rights they are granting to MPavilion, Art Monthly Australasia and NAVA; and that it is in no way whatever an infringement of any existing copyright or licence or any other right of any person.

Copyright of the essay shall remain the winning writer's property. The winning writer must grant MPavilion, Art Monthly Australasia and NAVA the right to use, reproduce, publish and communicate the essay and to authorise its use, reproduction, publication and communication in connection with the MPavilion/Art Monthly Australasia Writing Award.
